TIP: Be Clear and Concise

SECRET: Clarity and concision are a simple way of turning an A- paper to an A.

Obvious Implications: Delete words that can be implied.

EX: Energy used to power industries and homes will in years to come cost more money. (cut words in red and add "will eventually")


<u>Meaningless words</u>: Delete words that add nothing to the sentence

Ex: Some polling sites reported various technical problems, but these did not really affect the election's actual results.

<u>A phrase for a word</u>: Sometimes you can cut out a phrase in exchange for a word

Ex: A sail-powered craft that has turned on its side or completely over must remain buoyant enough so that it will bear the weight of those individuals who were aboard.

(CHANGE TO: A capsized sailboat must support those on it)
